


In her first novel 12-year-old Hannah Balter, the older sibling of twins, and granddaughter of a grandfather twin, tells a compelling story of human connection.





In his debut novel Smoking in Bed, Paul Kleiman tackles these question with humor, pathos and a cameo by Dick Cheney.


